## **TVCL FAIR PLAY AWARD**

The First Placed Club shall receive the Rod Dye Fair Play Trophy and £1,000 prize money. Runners-up shall also receive a cash prize as per the table.

The Total Prize money pot will be £3,150.

In the event that Clubs are tied for a position, then the value of the positions will be shared e.g. 2 Clubs are Tied 4<sup>th</sup> place – they would receive £200 each (250+150/2)

The Prize Winners will be announced at the AGM in November.

## **Calculation Method**

Captains mark their opposition Team with a score from 10 to 1.

The Total Marks received during the Season (less any penalties for forfeits) divided by the Number of games played gives the individual Team Average.

Forfeits: If a team forfeits a match then it will be given a mark of 7 (if it notifies the opposition and reports the result on TVCL16 before the cut-off time set out in Match Rule 12.5) or 4 (if does not).

## Aggregation

These Team based Captains marking results will then be aggregated at Club Level divided by the Number of Teams\* to provide a Club Average.

In addition to the Club Average, this will be combined with a Divisional Ranking. The highest "Fair Play" Marked Team in a Division will receive 10 points, down to 10<sup>th</sup> place receiving 1 point. The Divisional Ranking Points are then aggregated at Club Level, and then divided by the Number of Teams\*.

The Number of Teams, has an adjustment applied based on a probability factor of receiving the highest marks across multiple teams.

Number of Teams	1	2	3	4	5	6
Adjusted Probability Factor	1	1.89	2.78	3.67	4.56	5.45

The Clubs are then Ranked by their Club Average and the separate Divisional Ranking Average. These two rankings are then combined to provide a Combined Ranking Average.

Where two or more Clubs have the same Combined Ranking Average, then the best Club Average is used as the differentiator.
